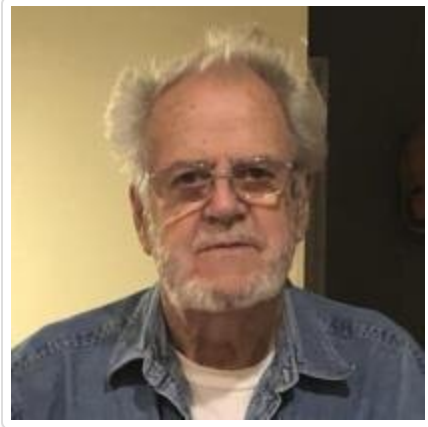




Camden D. "Cam" Brown
